Conference Description:

Conference Faculty

Dr. Anna Bar is a Professor of Dermatology and the Director of the Fellowship Program in Mohs Micrographic Surgery and Dermatologic Oncology and has trained fellows since 2006 in this advanced technique. Dr. Bar received her medical degree from New York University medical school, followed by an internal medicine internship at New York's Lenox Hill Hospital, Dermatology residency at OHSU, and Mohs surgery fellowship at the California Skin Institute. She serves as Treasurer for the American Society of Dermatologic Surgery and is on the Board of Directors for the Association of Academic Cosmetic Dermatologists. Dr. Bar enjoys spending time with her husband, who is also speaking at this meeting, and her daughters. She likes wake surfing, golfing, snowboarding and beach volleyball.

Dr. Markus Boos is an attending pediatric dermatologist at Seattle Children's Hospital and is an Associate Professor in the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Washington School of Medicine, and also serves as the Director of the Dermatology Residency Program. Dr. Boos received a BA in Biology and Economics from Kalamazoo College in Kalamazoo, MI. He then joined the Medical Scientist Training Program at the University of Chicago, for his MD and a PhD degree in Immunology. He completed an internship in Pediatrics at the University of Chicago's Comer Children's Hospital before joining the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania as a Dermatology resident. There he served as chief resident in his final year before completing a fellowship in Pediatric Dermatology at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. Dr. Boos enjoys caring for all children with skin disorders but has a special interest in LGBTQIA2S+ health, the effects of climate change (including wildfires) on the skin, and the cutaneous manifestations of Primary Immunodeficiency Disorders.

Dr. Jennie Clarke is a Professor in the Department of Dermatology at the University of Utah School of Medicine where she serves as the Vice-Chair for Education and the Program Director of the Dermatology Residency Program. Dr. Clarke's clinical and academic focus is on complex medical dermatology, with a particular emphasis on rheumatologic/autoimmune skin disease and complex medical dermatology. She also has a passion for medical education and has extensive experience in teaching medical students, residents, and practicing dermatology clinicians.

Dr. Joel Cohen is the Director of AboutSkin Dermatology and Aesthetics and AboutSkin Research in Greenwood Village, Colorado. Dr. Cohen attended Mount Sinai School of Medicine before completing his internship and residency at Henry Ford Hospital. Subsequently, he completed a fellowship at the University of British Columbia in Mohs Micrographic Surgery and Cutaneous Oncology. He is a Board-Certified Dermatologist, and is Fellowship-trained in Lasers, Aesthetics Dermatology and Dermatologic Surgery.

Dr. Nisma Mujahid is an assistant professor of dermatology at the University of Utah. Dr. Mujahid began her journey to medicine with a biochemistry degree from Mississippi State University before attending Boson University School of Medicine where she earned her medical degree and a PhD. She completed her internship at the University of Florida before continuing on to dermatology residency at the University of Utah Spencer Fox Eccles School of Medicine. Dr. Mujahid has specialized expertise in caring for patients with pigmentary disorders such as vitiligo, erythema dyschromicum perstans and lichen planus pigmentosa in both children and adults. She also specializes in skin of color and multi-ethnic skin. In addition, she enjoys caring for general dermatology patients in her clinics. Dr. Mujahid is also committed to the education of dermatology residents, medical students and research in dermatology.

Dr. Angela Jiang is a board-certified dermatologist and dermatopathologist. Originally from Michigan, she earned her medical degree from Loyola University Chicago, completed her dermatology residency at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit, and went on to pursue a dermatopathology fellowship at the University of Pennsylvania. She is currently an assistant professor at Oregon Health & Science University, where she cares for patients with general dermatologic and nail conditions and practices as a dermatopathologist. In addition to her clinical work, Dr. Jiang is actively involved in the education of medical students and dermatology residents.

Dr. Kevin White is an Associate Professor of Dermatology and Pathology, and the Director of the Division of Dermatopathology at Oregon Health & Science University. He received his medical degree from Jefferson Medical College in Philadelphia, followed by an Internal Medicine internship at Pennsylvania Hospital, Dermatology residency at OHSU, and Dermatopathology fellowship at the University of Virginia. Outside of practice, Dr. White enjoys spending time with his wife, Anna, and two daughters. He loves to ski, is an avid runner, and enjoys spending most weekends travelling everywhere for his kids' club volleyball teams.
